Welcome to the Fall-Winter edition of the Healdsburg Recreation Guide. Fall is an exciting time in Healdsburg with kids back to school, harvesting in the agricultural areas, and continued interest in Healdsburg from our tourists.

We're excited to unveil a full lineup of programs and services for you this fall. This fall will mark the fourth year of Fall Recreational Youth Soccer League, and our focus is on skill development, fair play and competitive fun. Volunteer coaches lead practices and games, and experienced recreation department staff provides training and support to coaches. Practices begin in August; games begin in September. We're also pleased to continue our new Adult Soccer League into the fall. Anyone 18 years and older is welcome to play in this co-ed league. Each league is a 9v9 Co-Ed format and limited to six teams. Games will be played at Recreation Park under the lights.

The City is also in the middle of several planning projects. The City will take ownership of the top of Fitch Mountain in November 2017 and open the property for public use. One of the first steps in moving Fitch Mountain from private ownership to a public amenity is completing a management plan for the property. The management plan evaluates the property from an ecological and recreational perspective, identifies areas of focus for restoring and enhancing important natural resources, develops a plan for creating and maintain recreational opportunities, and guides future work and financial commitments. We are also in design updates for the upcoming Saggio Hills Park and the Community Center Synthetic Turf project. También estamos en actualizaciones de diseño para los próximos proyectos del Parque Saggio Hills y el proyecto de césped del Centro Comunitario. ACTIVITY ASSISTANCE (SCHOLARSHIP) PROGRAM

The City of Healdsburg wants every resident to have the opportunity to participate in our recreation programs. The Activity Assistance Program ensures that eligible Healdsburg residents are afforded this opportunity. Program fee assistance is by application; assistance offered for approved applicants is 50% of the total program fee. Staff reserves the right to offer additional assistance on an individual basis based on demonstrated need. Maximum assistance per person, per year is \$150. For an application or more information please contact us at 431-3301. The application is also available for download at www.cityofhealdsburg.org.

Please note: Not all programs offered by the Community Services Department are eligible for assistance. The Friends of the Senior Center organization is pleased to offer the Rose Pavoni Scholarship. This scholarship is meant to help Healdsburg's older adults cover program/registration fees for classes or activities held at the Senior Center. This program is separate from the department's activity assistance program. For details and or to apply please contact the Senior Center at 431-3324.

All classes are held at the Healdsburg Community Center unless otherwise noted. Classes are taught by trained recreation staff or by contracted instructors who are skilled and experienced in their area of specialty.

Contract instructors are identified in class listings by color. Contract instructors develop their program curriculum and may charge a materials fee in addition to the program fee. Materials fees are payable directly to the instructor on the first day of the class.

All classes and camps have a minimum number of enrollees required to conduct the class. We encourage registration no less than 7 days prior to the first date of the class to prevent disappointing cancellations due to low enrollment.

We're here to answer any questions you may have about our classes, instructors or appropriate placement in a class. Call us at 431-3301 or email us at communityservices@ci.healdsburg.ca.us with your questions and comments.

Cancellation/Refund Policy: The Community Services Department reserves the right to cancel classes due to lack of enrollment or for any other unforeseen circumstance. In the event that the Department, or contract instructor, cancels a class or program enrollees will receive a full refund. Refund requests made by participant 72 hours prior to the start of a class will be issued a full refund minus a \$5 administration fee. Requests received less than 72 hours prior to start of class will be assessed a \$10 administrative fee. Administrative fees are waived if the participant transfers to another class or program. Refund requests made during the course of an activity will be prorated and subject to a \$10 administration fee. Failure to attend a program or "no shows" will not be granted a refund.

El personal reserva el derecho a ofrecer ayuda adicional sobre una base individual basada en necesidad demostrada. Asistencia máxima por persona y por año es de \$150. Nota: No todos los programas ofrecidos por el Departamento de Servicos Comunitarios son elegibles para la ayuda. Los instructores de contrato pueden tener un costo de materiales adicional, además de la tarifa del programa; este costo de materiales se paga directamente al instructor en el primer día de la clase

Estamos encantados de ofrecer una amplia variedad de clases y campamentos de temporada. Todos los programas tienen un número mínimo de participantes que son requeridos para llevar acabo las clases. Aconsejamos a los participantes a que se registren para las clases no menos de 7 días antes de la fecha que comienza la clase para evitar cancelaciones debido a la baja inscripción.

Póliza de Cancelaciones/Reembolsos: El

Departamento de Servicos Comunitarios reserva el derecho de cancelar clases debido a la falta de inscripción o por cualquier otra circumstancia imprevista. En caso de que el Departamento, o instructor contratado, cancele una clase o programa, los participantes recibirán un reembolso completo. Si hace una solicitud de reembolso antes de 72 horas antes de que comience una clase, los participantes recibirán un reembolso completo y se les cobrara una tarifa administrativa de \$5. Las solicitudes recibidas en menos de 72 horas antes del comienzo de la clase, se les cobrara una tarifa administrativa de \$10. No se le cobrara gastos administrativos si el participante se transfiere a otra clase o programa. Las solicitudes de reembolso realizadas durante el curso de una actividad serán prorrateadas (porción de pago tomado de acuerdo a los días que han transcurrido) y están sujetas a una cuota administrativa de \$10. Al participante que no se presente o asista a un programa ("no shows") no sera reembolsado.

PARKS & PICNIC RESERVATIONS

The City of Healdsburg maintains eight beautiful parks within our City limits and we invite you to come out and enjoy them! Most parks have picnic tables available for use at no cost on a first-come first-served basis year round. Picnic Reservations (Permits) guarantee a spot for your event. Our group picnic sites range in size from four to ten tables; the amenities vary from park to park. A minimum of 41 people is required to reserve the large site; the small sites may be reserved for a maximum of 40 people. Reservations for groups of all sizes are recommended and may be made up to one year in advance and no later than two weeks before picnic date. Inflatable Bounce Structures provided by professional companies are currently allowed in some Healdsburg City Parks by permit only. HEALDSBURG RIDGE OPEN SPACE PRESERVE

Throughout this beautiful property you find breathtaking views of the Mayacamas Mountains, Fitch Mountain, Lake Sonoma basin, the coastal range and the Russian River at River's Bend. The easy to access trails wander through oak woodland, serpentine chaparral, wetlands and mixed evergreen forests. This natural preserve abounds with wildlife and opportunities for hiking, bird watching and nature discovery. In partnership with the Sonoma County Agricultural Preservation and Open Space District and LandPaths, the City of Healdsburg Community Services Department continues to manage this diverse open space for public recreation and the protection of valuable natural resources. The trailhead is located at the eastern end of Arabian Way. For more information and a trail map please visit www.cityofhealdsburg.org.

BADGER PARK TRAILS

Badger Park features a quarter-mile gravel walking path around the grass area. Additionally, as part of the installation of the pedestrian bridge and walking pathway linking the west end of Badger Park with Second Street, a half-mile interconnecting trail system allows park visitors to wander through the riparian habitat adjacent to Badger Park and connecting with a trail along the banks of the Russian River.

FOSS CREEK PATHWAY & ART TRAIL

The Foss Creek Pathway and Art Trail now extends from Grove Street near Dry Creek Road south to the Chamber of Commerce. The Community Services Department, in conjunction with the Voigt Family Sculpture Foundation has designed this section of the pathway to display sculptures from internationally renowned artists. When complete, the Foss Creek Pathway will provide a walking and cycling path from the north end of the city limits south to the Russian River at Railroad Park. For more information please visit:

HEALDSBURG TREE WALK

COMMUNITY CENTER IGROW

PROGRAM GARDEN

The Healdsburg Community Services Department is seeking volunteers to help plant, nurture and harvest produce grown at the Community Center iGrow Program Garden. This volunteer, community-based gardening project utilizes the wonderful raised garden boxes at the Community Center supporting the Sonoma County Health Action goals of growing, eating and sharing healthy food within our community.

The Community Services Department utilizes the garden as a learning environment for children in our after school programs, camps and youth programs as well as for growing specifically for the purpose of supplying the Healdsburg Food Pantry with fresh, organic produce. This year over 1,000 pounds of tomatoes, squash, lettuce and cucumbers will be donated to the Food Panty . Volunteers also reap the benefits of the garden as they are able to take home fresh produce. Looking for a novel idea for your child's birthday? Let our trained staff handle the fun and activities for your child's next party!

PRESCHOOL BIRTHDAY PARTIES (3-5 YRS)

Parents can relax and enjoy the fun as the Early Childhood Education and Recreation Staff put on a party for preschoolers at the Community Center! The two-hour party package includes the use of the multi-purpose room for special games and activities that are focused on a playful, age-appropriate theme, supervised by trained staff.

CHOICE OF PRESCHOOL PARTY THEMES:

- **Pirates & Princesses** Children will dress up as a pirate or princess and board the "ship" in search of treasure! Digging for gold and jewels, games of "walk the plank", and treasure hunts will be included. Each child will create a pirate hat or royal crown, and decorate a treasure box to take home.
- Sports of All Sorts Children will get moving as we explore a variety of different sports such as t-ball, soccer, gymnastics, football and basketball. Children will create a hand-puppet athlete/game and decorate a medal to take home.

We can arrange for an 'All Sorts of Sports' party allowing guests to try out a bit of everything! Come out and have a ball! These parties are held at the Healdsburg Community Center.

PARTY PLANNING INFORMATION

MRU & Outdoor parties are offered April-October. Preschool and Indoor parties at the Healdsburg Community Center are offered November-March. Parents bring decorations and refreshments. Party planning staff member will meet with parents to help plan party. Parties are available Saturdays from 10 am-12 pm, & 2-4 pm or on Sunday from 2-4 pm. Party applications MUST be received a minimum of 3 weeks prior to the desired party date. An \$82 nonrefundable application fee is due with the submission of an application and it applies to the total party fee. Applications are available online at www.cityofhealdsburg.org and at the Healdsburg Community Center. Fee: \$200 (Up to 12 Children) / \$240 (13-20 Children)

The City of Healdsburg Community Services
Department provides three programs for the after school care of students. These programs are a partnership with HUSD and The Healdsburg School to ensure a meaningful connection between the school day and after school curriculum. Programs operate each school day from the last bell to 6 pm. The daily schedule includes mandatory time for homework assistance, enrichment activities and a nutritional snack.

AFTER SCHOOL SAFETY & EDUCATION PROGRAM (ASES)

KIDS ON CAMPUS (GRADES K-5)

The children are bussed from Healdsburg Elementary and Fitch Mountain schools to the Community Center.

THE CLUB H PROGRAM

(GRADES 6-8)

Located at the Healdsburg Junior High Campus. Students have the option of walking home with written permission from their parents.



NO FEE OPTION

HUSD and the Community Services Department receive state funding through the After School Safety and Education (ASES) program. This funding allows students in the HUSD who are referred to the program by their school, to attend the programs at no cost provided they meet the attendance requirements (which are set forth by the grant). The grant limits the number of children who may be served, enrollment is on a first-come, first serve basis.

FEE OPTION

The programs are also open to all children, regardless of which school they attend and without the attendance requirements for a nominal fee. Families have the option to enroll at any time, provided space is available, for a monthly fee. Enrollment is on a pre-arranged, not drop-in basis. Two days per week is required; parents are responsible for transportation to the program. Bus transportation is available from HES and FMC for an additional fee. AFTER SCHOOL ACADEMY AT THE HEALDSBURG SCHOOL

(THS STUDENTS ONLY)

The Community Services Department is pleased to offer an after school program for the students of The Healdsburg School. The program, located on the THS campus, includes homework assistance, outdoor play, enrichment activities and a nutritional snack. Families have the option of enrolling on a trimester or drop-in basis. Students must have the program registration form on file before being allowed to participate in the program. Drop-in fee is expected to be paid at pick up on day of service.

WHO PAYS FOR OUR COMMUNITY SERVICES?

The Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) also referred to as a "bed tax" or "room tax" is a tax assessed to visitors staying in all lodging establishments within the city limits. This includes hotels, motels, resorts, inns, suites and B&Bs.

The current TOT rate in Healdsburg is 12%.

In 2004, voters passed a ballot measure to ensure there would be an ongoing funding source for parks, recreation and open space designating 10% to fund our Community Services. The remaining 2% goes into the General Fund to support public safety. No other tax dollars fund the Community Services Department.
